



Roles and Responsibilities



- Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Reviewing Entity
 - Hold public hearing
 - DNR makes decision on exception application
 - Staff from MD Park Service handling Scenic and Wild River application and addressing impacts to natural resources
- Garrett County Government Applicant
 - Project lead in cooperation with State Highway Administration
 - Manage and maintain roadway and bridge
 - Oversee project design, apply for permits and approvals
- GPI Applicant's Consultant
 - Engineering consultant hired by Garrett County
 - Developed and submitted Scenic and Wild River application


Project Overview



- Existing bridge is a "temporary" single-lane, Acrow panel truss structure
- It was placed over original two span (support in middle of the river) bridge in 2011 when that bridge was closed due to structural deterioration
- Original bridge is 20' wide by 101' long
- New bridge will be 35' feet wide by 120' long
- Includes bicycle compatible shoulders and a sidewalk as required by FHWA
- Average daily traffic is 400 465 vehicles per day

Purpose of Scenic and Wild Rivers Regulations






- Designated rivers possess
 outstanding scenic, ecologic,
 recreational and cultural values
- State policy is to preserve and protect these areas
- River and riparian areas are generally undeveloped and in a natural state
- Regulations in COMAR
 08.15.01 04 regulate activity in the river corridor

Regulations






- Damming, dredging, filling, channelization, or other alteration of the river or its banks is prohibited except that involving the repair of existing bridges
- Project involves construction of a new bridge
- COMAR 08.15.03.03 allows for "exceptions"

Exception Requirements





- Consistent with legislative intent
- Not injurious to scenic and wild character
- Special circumstances exist that strict application of regulations would cause unnecessary hardship
- Public hearing is required
- DNR shall make a decision on exception request within 60 days


