- The DNR needs this information to determine the number of oysters being harvested from the Bay and where those oysters are coming from. This is also a federal Shellfish Sanitation requirement.
- Please be as specific as possible when referring to bar names, especially when there is more than one bar with the same name in the Bay (Middleground, Flat Rock, etc.).
- Include the bay, river or creek, or the NOAA code AND the bar name. Please do not write “Tangier Sound” or “South River” without including a bar name.
- Refer to the names and numbers of the official Yates bars provided on the maps in the 2012-2013 Shellfish Closure Areas Book and use them to fill out the “Oyster Bar or Bars Where Caught” column. Please provide the GPS coordinates if a bar is not listed anywhere on these charts.
- Remember to record the number of crew (not counting yourself) and the total number of hours worked because this information is no longer required on the buy ticket.
- Always write the buyer license number of whom you sold your oysters to.
