

# Standards and Practices Revision

### 2016-2017 Land Trust Standards and Practices Revisions Process

The Land Trust Alliance first developed *Land Trust Standards and Practices* (the Standards) in 1989 at the urging of land trust practitioners who believe a strong land trust community depends on the credibility and effectiveness of all its members and who understand that employing best practices is the surest way to lasting conservation. The Alliance led a process to revise the Standards in 1993, 2001 and 2004 to reflect changes in land trust practices and regulations governing nonprofit organizations. Since that time, the land trust community has made great strides securing public confidence in its work. Land trusts are stronger, better managed and more effective than ever. More than 1,100 land trusts have adopted the Standards, reflecting an ongoing commitment to continuous improvement across the community.

The Alliance is leading a collaborative process to revise the Standards to reflect changes in the legal and operational environment of the land trust community over the past 10 years and to provide overall alignment with the Land Trust Accreditation Program, Terrafirma and the wide array of resources and documents supporting best practices for land trusts. By engaging the entire land trust community, the revisions process will also strive to build greater awareness and support for Standards and Practices and to encourage all land trusts to implement them.

#### **Revision Goals**

The Land Trust Alliance is leading a process to work directly with the land trust community to revise the Standards. The goals of the process are to:

- Update the Standards to reflect changes over the past decade in the legal and operational environment of the land trust community
- Build greater awareness and support for the Standards
- Encourage all land trusts to use the Standards as a foundation for their work
- Ensure overall alignment of the Standards with the Land Trust Accreditation Program, Terrafirma and the wide array of resources and documents supporting best practices for land trusts

Finalize overall recommendations for Standards and Practices revisions	December 2016 or May 2017
Land Trust Alliance board approves Standards and Practices revisions	February or June 2017
