2020 Bear Hunt

- 117 Bears Harvested
 - 83 GA; 23 AL; 8 WA; 3 FR
- Challenges
 - Natural Food Shortages
 - Bears not found in traditional areas
 - Pushed onto private land
 - Weather was challenging
- Private Land Harvest Increased
 - 74% Private (up from 65%)

Agricultural Bear Damage Permit Program

- Farmers experiencing 'severe' bear damage qualify for EITHER a hunting permit valid on their land during bear hunting season OR compensation
- Examples of 'severe' damage include livestock attacks, 2 acres of field corn, 15 wrapped hay bales, etc.
- 18 Permits issued in 2017; 32 in 2018; 24 in 2019; 49 in 2020
- 7.9% hunter/22.4% permit success on ag permits vs. 4.2% hunter/11.2% permit success via lottery
