
Virginia's Sunday Hunting Law

- Signed into law March 5, 2014.
- Allowed most forms of hunting on Sundays, except that hunting cannot occur within 200 yards of a house of worship and hunting deer or bear with a gun, firearm, or other weapon with the aid or assistance of dogs on Sundays is prohibited.




Duck and Goose Harvest in Virginia Pre and Post-Sunday Hunting

- 2009-2013 Pre-Sunday Hunting.
- 2014-2018 Post-Sunday Hunting.
- Used data from FWS Harvest Surveys – 1,000-1,700 hunting trips/year.
- Duck Season 60 hunting days, 3 segments in all years
- Goose Seasons 3 zones (AP, RP, SJBP).




Virginia Goose Harvest




Virginia Duck Harvest



Conclusions

- The addition of Sundays for migratory bird hunting did not change the overall duck and goose harvest appreciably.
- Duck harvest on Sundays was comparable to duck harvest occurring on Mondays-Thursdays and about 1/3 that of Saturdays.
- The popularity of duck hunting on Sundays is increasing over time, but remains far less than Saturdays.
